CYBERSECURITY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

Technology breaches – customer credit card data being stolen from a big box store, or consumer data being stolen from Experian – have become more commonplace, creating a reality of increased security measures and constant monitoring of organizational and personal data to ensure our identities, credit card numbers or bank accounts have not been compromised.

This new reality has made many realize that keeping systems secure is not solely the responsibility of information technology employees. Rather, it is incumbent on every individual to do their part to keep critical personal and our organization's data safe from potential breaches.

It can seem a little overwhelming at times, and the idea that the next threat is always lurking around the corner can be stressful. But there are things you can do to protect your personal data, along with BENCO's data.

KEEP YOUR DEFENSES UP

- Make sure all your computer software including your web browser – are updated with the latest software. Keeping software up-to-date ensures security patches being deployed by our security team can succeed in blocking security threats.
- Create a strong password and keep it private it

could take up to two centuries to crack a password consisting of 12 characters or more!

 Treat all Wi-Fi networks as a potential security risk.
Encrypt sensitive data when using a public Wi-Fi network and never check financial or other sensitive accounts when using public Wi-Fi.

messages that try to get to secure data. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. If something seems off, trust your instinct and convey your concerns to a manager or member of the security team.

Refrain from clicking on links or attached files in emails or text messages from senders you don't know. Even if you do know the sender, hover over the link before you click as they may have been hacked or someone could be spoofing them. There are many ways to spot a phish, and you can visit www.staysafeonline.org to see them all.

CO-OPS WORKING TOGETHER

Electric co-ops, along with the Department of Energy and NRECA, are working together through the RC3 Program, to better protect us from security threats.

From the smallest co-op with limited access to technology staff to the largest co-op with greater resources, NRECA and America's electric cooperatives are creating a co-op network that fosters a culture of cybersecurity.

Whether keeping your data safe at home or on the go, remember: you are the first line of defense against cyber security threats!

PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR A WINTER AWAY

If you are fortunate enough to have a second home or destination to escape to during the winter months, you will want to make sure that your primary residence is safe and maintained while you are away. Here are some tips to keep your home secure and your electrical service current while you are enjoying your winter retreat:

ELECTRIC SERVICE MAINTENANCE

- Ensure your electric account stays current including paying your bill. Members can have their bill forwarded to a different address or emailed.
- Members can sign-up for automatic payments.

HOME SECURITY MAINTENANCE

 Test your security system monthly to make sure it is communicating with the response center.



- Automate indoor and outdoor lights to simulate someone being home.
- Be sure your home security sign is visible.

- Turn off and unplug unnecessary lights and appliances.
- Refrain from posting online about your travel until you return.
- Check doors and windows to ensure they are locked.
- Have your mail held at the post office if you will be gone longer than a week. Ask a trusted neighbor to pick up any packages that arrive in your absence.
- Set your thermostat lower to save money, but not below 55 degrees to prevent frozen pipes and damaged appliances. If you have a smart thermostat, you can adjust the temperature from your mobile device so your house is the right temperature upon your return.
- Store valuable and important items in a hidden fire resistant safe.
